PASTOR'S MESSAGE:

Signs of Spring

Spring has Sprung! The snow has melted, and the days are getting warmer. Isn't it wonderful to hear these words? It has been a long, cold and snowy winter, but it is behind us now.

When the weather warms up I love taking walks outside. It may sound strange to you, but I think it's even better if it's raining. There is a special stillness in the air when raindrops gently fall on the trees and rooftops. When it's raining, I notice things differently than on a good weather day.



A walk in the rain inspires me to think deeply. When I look around at God's good creation, I begin to think about my life's joys and concerns. But I am often interrupted by the inspiration of nature around me being watered by God. It demands my attention. I notice things I had previously just walked past – like the tall old oak tree that has seen many more years of life than me. I notice the damage to evergreens that have been gnawed at over the winter by local deer. I notice the fresh buds on trees that were knocked down prematurely by the Spring rain.

I enjoy getting outside in the Springtime to do yard clean-up. I pick up last year's dead plants and leaves, and branches broken by the winter storms, and burn them in the fire pit. I walk around the house and look for new sprouts coming out of the ground where I planted perennials last year. My irises and day-lilies and primrose are all showing signs of life. It is beautiful to see this resilient display of new life springing forth despite the presence of dead leaves still hanging on from last' year's growth. This new life seems quite oblivious to winter's destruction, and it doesn't even seem to care that the day is chilly and rainy.

New life is all around us this time of year. Sometimes we can see it plainly, like the new sprouts of plants, and sometimes we have to wait a little longer for the ground to get warmer to see it. We know it is there and that it will come in abundance. It is persistent, no matter what obstacles from past days it may have had to overcome. It is also very adaptable, which makes it well equipped for the days ahead. God provides the conditions it needs – rain and warmth. God provides the necessary healing, and the dying, preparing it for yet another season of life to carry on.

We gain much wisdom about God and our own life when we observe the ways of nature. As Paul said in his letter to the Romans (1:20): "Ever since the creation of the world, God's eternal power and divine nature, invisible though they are, have been understood and seen through the things God has made." Surely we understand the experiences of death and new life in our daily living. There are times lives when we go through the struggles of loss, death, and fear. But we know those times are always followed by new days that are warmed by God's grace - days which bring hope and optimism to us once again. This is God's promise to us.

The changing of the seasons blesses us with the gift of new life. I hope you will get outside and spend some time with the miracles of creation happening just beyond your door. God's love is calling out to you from the sprouts and rainy days, to come and see. May your hearts be filled with joy through the signs of new life you will find!
